

# THE TRIBAL KNOT

*A Memoir of Family, Community,  
and a Century of Change*

Rebecca McClanahan

Drawing on hundreds of personal letters, artifacts, and documents spanning more than a century, Rebecca McClanahan reconstructs the daily, intersecting lives of her ancestors, searching for her own place within the extended family. The cast of characters is large, the timeline long, but at its center is the Mounts family, one of the author's ancestral strands, a hardscrabble band of Midwest farmers, hunters, trappers, and laborers who migrated to Central Indiana and Wisconsin during the 1880s. And at the center of this cast of characters is Bessie, the author's maternal great-aunt, a strong presence during the author's childhood and adolescence. Like Bessie, the other members of the Mounts tribe survive numerous dark chapters—poverty, war, political upheavals, illness and accident, filicide and suicide, economic depressions, personal crises, and global disasters—while struggling to hold tight to the ties that bind them.

**REBECCA MCCLANAHAN**, the author of nine previous books, including *The Riddle Song and Other Rememberings*, which won the Glasgow award in nonfiction, is the recipient of a Pushcart Prize, the Wood Prize from *Poetry*, and fellowships from New York Foundation for the Arts, the North Carolina Arts Council, and the MacDowell Colony.
